Greetings from Augustana University!

What a difference a year — and a global pandemic — can make. We have been reflecting on how the world quickly changed in March of last year. COVID-19 has impacted each of us in numerous ways. Our students left for spring break and, in the blink of an eye, the world changed. Our faculty quickly pivoted to modify the curriculum for online instruction in one week's time — an unprecedented accomplishment. Our entire community rallied together to serve students and each other in a time of great uncertainty.

Throughout the spring and summer of 2020, over fifty faculty and staff members worked diligently to develop the Viking Flex Plan — designed to allow AU to safely deliver a top quality in-person living and learning experience in the 2020-21 academic year. The plan incorporated face-to-face learning with an integrated virtual learning component in many classes. Students and employees committed to a Viking Flex Health and Safety Pledge, which reinforced the need to closely follow all of the health and safety protocols established for the well-being of our campus community.

While many colleges and universities delivered education in a virtual format, Augustana was successful in providing a safe in-person living and learning experience for the entire year. Thanks be to God!

Augustana recently celebrated commencement, with the classes of 2020 and 2021, in our beautiful Kirkeby–Over Stadium. We are so grateful for the

support and prayers of our alumni, which were instrumental in helping the university navigate this unprecedented year.

The unique 2020-2021 year included some great accomplishments.

Augustana launched two new schools, the Sharon Lust School of Education and the Augustana University School of Music. In the Fall of 2021, the School of Health Professions will be launched.

The Sharon Lust School of Education

- Dr. Laurie Daily serves as the inaugural dean.
- A generous donation from John Lust '90 and Jeanelle (Robson) Lust '91, in honor of John's mother, allowed Augustana to establish the Sharon Lust school of Education. John's mother dedicated her life's work to teaching and he remarked, "This gift will help empower generations of future educators and lifelong learners."

The Augustana University School of Music

- Dr. Peter Folliard serves as the inaugural dean.
- The School of Music utilized instrumental masks, bell covers and choral masks to ensure students could learn and perform safely.
- Augustana Christmas Vespers, one of our greatest traditions, was reimagined in 2020. With tremendous innovation and dedication, recordings of instrumentalists and vocalists occurred throughout the fall semester. A concert was then produced and live streamed on YouTube, as well as South Dakota Public Broadcasting, Prairie Public Broadcasting, Ozark Public Television and Rocky Mountain Public Broadcasting. We also had radio partners broadcast the performance in South Dakota, Minnesota, Iowa and Nebraska. A generous gift from Thrivent supported the endeavor and allowed the performance to be shared with its Midwest customers.
- The Augustana drumline was launched and the Augustana Marching Band will return in the fall of 2021.
- The creation of a multimedia entrepreneurship major will bring a program unique to the entire Midwest, and help our students thrive in exciting careers in music and more.

In the fall, President Stephanie Herseth Sandlin celebrated a milestone birthday. Her birthday wish was to raise funds for impact scholarships to

support current and future students. We set a goal of raising \$50,000 and blew out the candles celebrating a total of \$141,405.

Our student-athletes continued to excel under extraordinary circumstances. We had 87 student-athletes named to NSIC all-academic teams in the winter and 82 in the spring.
